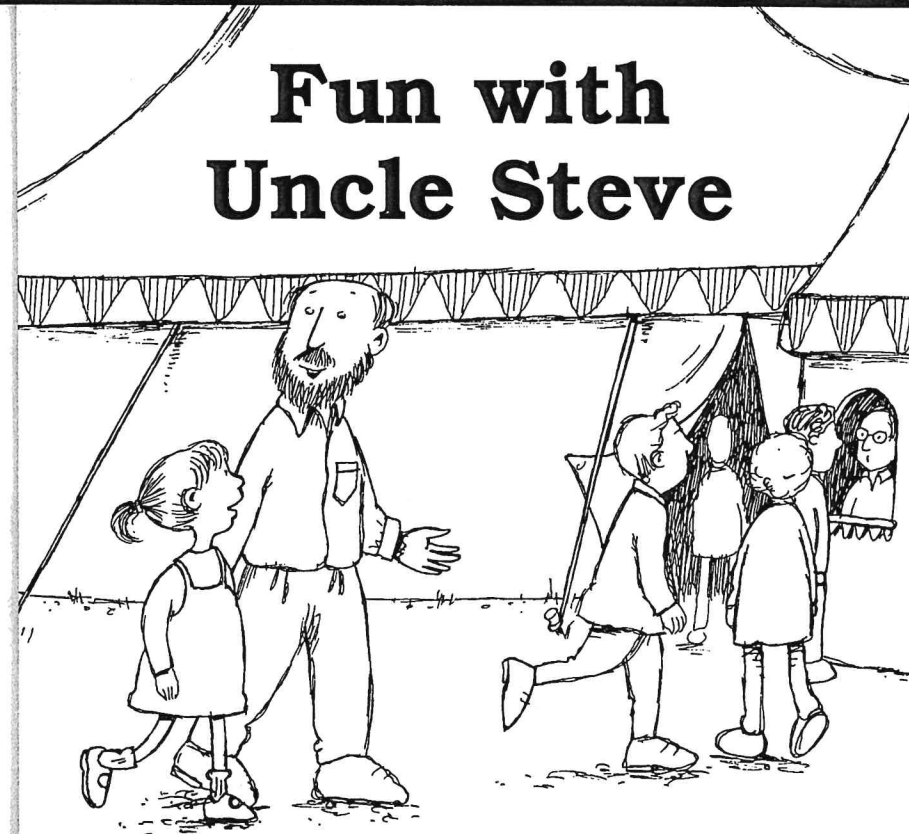

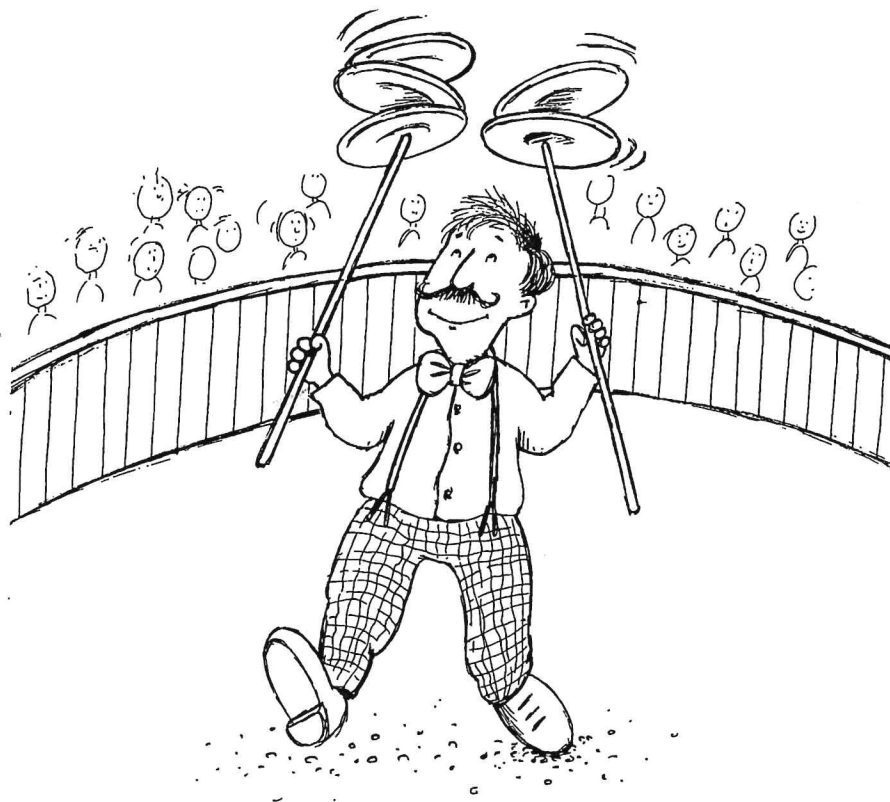
Uncle Steve picks me up. We go to the big top. Getting a ticket is not a hassle.

not a single plate drops!

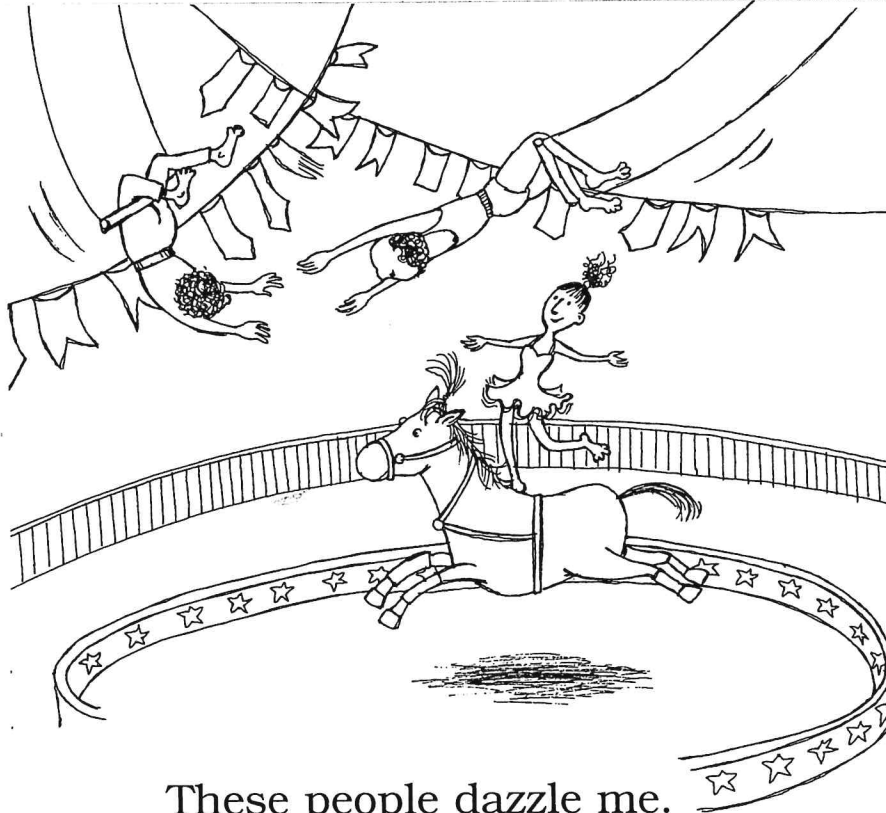


Then more people dash in.
